DERBY COUNTY WOMEN HISTORY



The club that was to become Derby County LFC started out as the idea of Sheila Rollinson and Jess Reid, who at the time were both playing for the Coventry-based ladies' side Holbrooks Athletic. Sheila had recently moved to the Derby area and Jess lived in Burton, so they came up with the idea of forming a new more locally based team.

Adverts for players were placed in both the Burton Mail and the Derby Evening Telegraph and at that time more of the replies came from the Burton area, so Burton Wanderers was born. The club's first season was 1978/79 in the Midland League (which later became the West Midlands League).

The following season they decided to move to the Nottingham League (later the East Midlands League) due to the standard of football being of a higher level.

In 1985 the club changed its name to Beacon Wanderers, as its first sponsorship deal was secured with the Beacon Hotel. Gradually the balance of players swung more towards the Derby area and as the club name no longer included

Burton, it seemed sensible to move both matches and training sessions to Derby.

In 1990 John Jarman started the Community Department at Derby County Football Club and in the same year he held discussion with the management of Beacon Wanderers, which eventually led to the formation of Derby County Ladies FC.

From this point on the club developed and improved season on season. Playing in the Unison East Midlands League, they eventually captured the League and Cup double in 2004/05 and with it promotion to the Midland Combination. They soon won the Combination title and repeated it the following season to gain promotion the FA Women's Premier League.

Since that time they have been consistent performers at this level and have registered multiple victories in the Derbyshire County Cup.

SHAN TURNER

GOALKEEPER

Shan Turner is only a recent recruit to the old gold and black but has certainly made a good impression. Having signed prior to the start of this season she has stepped up to first team action and acquitted herself very well between the sticks.


An Under 19s Northern Ireland international back in 2016, she commenced her career with Birmingham City before moving to Coventry United who were then still a National League team. On the verges of the first team at Butts Avenue she was back-up to the experienced goalkeeper Sue Wood and made over two dozen starts for the reserves over a two-year period from 2016 to 2018.

The summer of 2018 saw her looking to further her career and become a regular at first team level. In July she joined Birmingham & West Midlands Ladies where she played alongside future Wolfettes Shannie Jennings, Alex Buck and Laura Cooper. She soon established herself at the Castle Vale Stadium and appeared in all but four games during the season, achieving four clean sheets. She also featured in a 3-1 win over Wolves at Castlecroft, Wolves' only home defeat of the season.

The 2019/20 season saw her an ever-present, with Birmingham & West Mids sitting in second place in the table when the season was curtailed in March. This time she kept seven clean sheets from the 21 fixtures and conceded only 27 goals throughout the campaign. Last term Birmingham & West Mids became Boldmere St Michael's and Turner featured in all seven of The Mikes' fixtures before the season was again concluded early.

When football returned at the end of last season Wolves found themselves in need of a goalkeeper as Becky Thomas suffered a hand injury and could not complete the final fixture of the Pygott and Crone Cup. Turner stepped in and helped Wolves complete a clean sweep of the fixtures and lift the cup. She then featured in the three friendlies which followed, concluding with the game against Lincoln City at Molineux.

Shan officially joined Wolves at the beginning of August last year and has quickly shown her skills. Alongside the defenders in front of her, she recorded five clean sheets as Wolves got off to an excellent start to the campaign. Prior to today's fixture she has featured a dozen times for Wanderers, kept eight clean sheets and conceded only seven goals. Not a bad way to introduce yourself to a new team!
