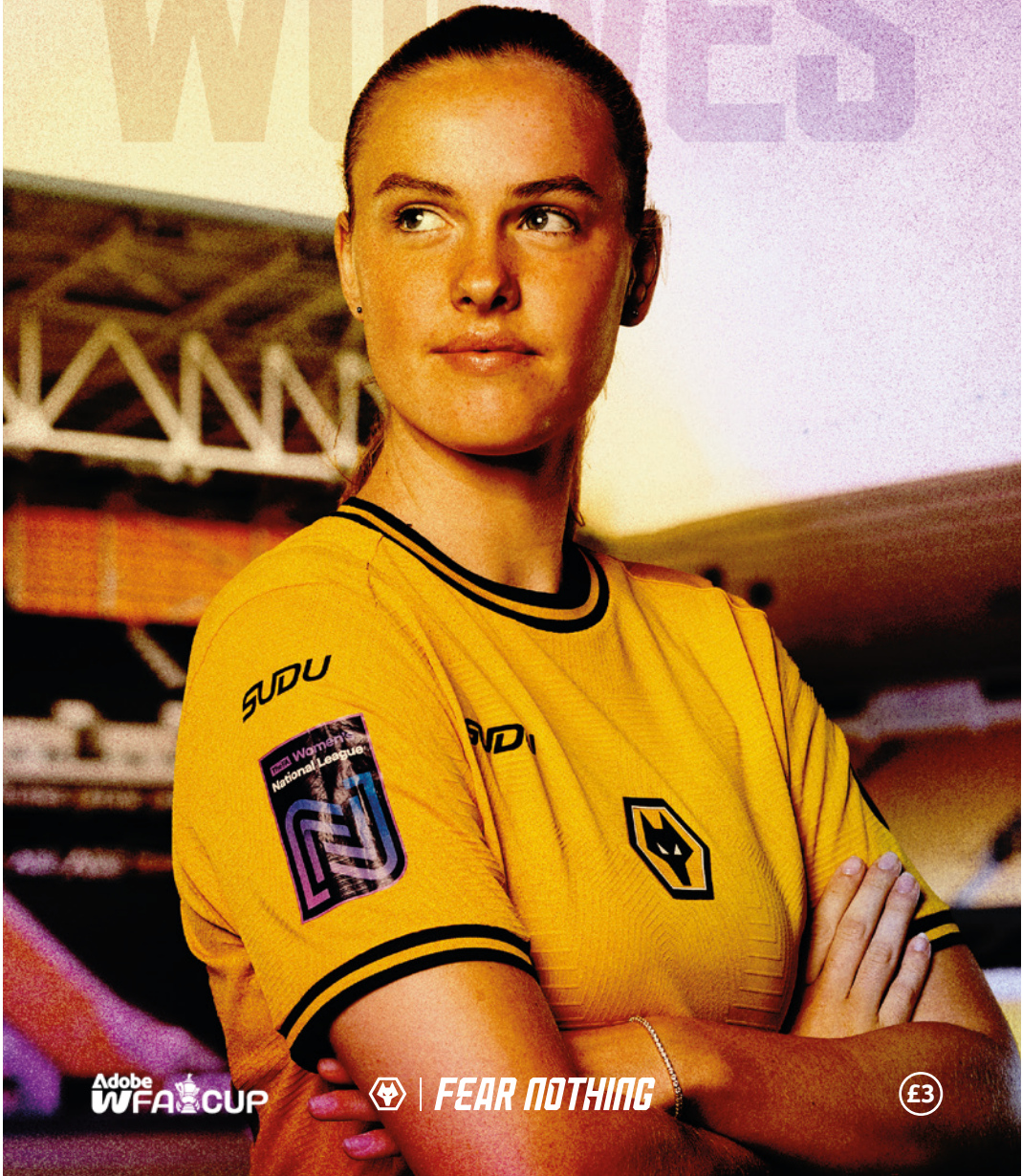

# KATIE JOHNSON

Wolves Women defender Katie Johnson is next to sit in the programme hot seat this season and answer a few quirky questions.

## WHAT IS THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACE YOU'VE PLAYED FOOTBALL?

I'm going to give the 'boring' answer, but it has to be Molineux for me, just because I'm from Wolves and I've been a Wolves fan all my life. But this season, there are a lot of teams who are playing regularly in Premier League stadiums, so we've played at Turf Moor, which was exciting, we've also played at Stoke's ground, as well as obviously the Hawthorns. I hadn't actually played at the Hawthorns before, so that was great for me, but I'm probably most looking forward to playing the City Ground against Forest. I've seen on social media how good that looks, so that's probably going to be the most exciting.

## WHAT ARE THE STRANGEST SUPERSTITIONS YOU'VE SEEN FROM TEAMMATES?

I know a few of the girls have a certain order they like to come out of the tunnel. Beth Merrick always comes out the changing room last, and I don't know whether that's a superstition or what, but Merrick Will's the same as well, so her and Beth would have a fight to see who would come out last! I'm not really a superstitious person though, but if I have a good game, I'll try and replicate what I did. Last season I was always having Weetabix for breakfast, but I've found it doesn't fill me up as much this season – maybe I've got more of an appetite now!

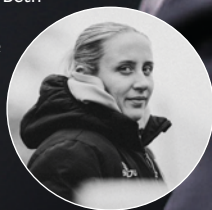
## WHAT IS THE GREATEST COMEBACK YOU'VE BEEN INVOLVED IN?

It's got to be that Nottingham Forest one from last season. We were 3-0 down and then Amber pressed the keeper to make it 3-1, and then there's Beth Merrick putting it in the bottom corner to make it 4-3. I think you could tell by the scenes with everyone just how

much that meant to us. But even at 3-0 down, we always thought that we could have got something, but it was really late in the game this one, like 20 minutes or something, but from the tempo and the energy that was on the pitch, I knew as soon as we got one, we were going to get something out of it. I didn't think we were going to win, and we would have taken a draw at that point, but we never really count ourselves out.

## WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST TASTE IN MUSIC?

This would have been easy last season because Ellie Wilson's was atrocious. I'd probably say Beth Roberts just because she's the DJ and sometimes she puts some questionable music on before games. We have to ask her to put something on that's actually going to get us up for the game! Although I wouldn't say Beth's taste is bad, sometimes it's questionable.



## WHAT IS THE STRANGEST MOMENT YOU'VE EXPERIENCED IN A GAME?

There's been a few funny moments rather than strange. One was last season when someone's boot came off in the game and all their laces had come out, but they were trying to put it back on sat on the pitch, but Helen Dermody just got their boot and chucked it off the pitch because we were in the middle of a game!



## WHO IS THE BIGGEST CHARACTER IN A DRESSING ROOM YOU'VE BEEN IN?

I wouldn't say we have any massive characters here. We all have our moments but we're all kind of on a similar level, which is why we work well as a group. If I had to say one, 'Robbo' is probably up there. Beth's a character, especially in training. We get fined if we get megged in training, so she's always trying to meg people, and just being a bit of a nuisance, to be honest.

## WHAT IS THE ODDEST THING YOU'VE HEARD SAID DURING MATCH?

I just completely zone out in games to what people are saying. I don't listen to anyone! But I remember Morph said something in one of the pre-season games which we found hilarious at the time. I can't remember exactly what happened, but there was a tough challenge and a foul was given and she said something like 'it's physics', trying to argue that it wasn't a foul.

## WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST DRESS SENSE?

I'll leave Robbo alone this time because I know my dress sense definitely needs some work. Abi Loydon has got a quirky dress sense. It's stuff that I would never wear, but she looks great in it. Again, it's not that Abi's got a bad dress sense, it's just different to what I would wear. It's definitely her own unique sense of style, but she absolutely rocks it, to be fair.

## WHAT IS THE MOST UNEXPECTED RESULT YOU'VE HAD?

Probably the most unexpected was when we beat Reading 2-1 last season in the FA Cup. We knew we had a chance, because I think they were in a tough place, but for us to actually win it, against a Championship club at the time, especially going 1-0 down was probably the most unexpected one.

## WHAT IS THE BEST GOAL YOU'VE EVER SEEN SCORED?

There's a couple again from a few seasons ago that I didn't actually see in person because I was on loan, but I saw them on the videos and the highlights. Beth Merrick has a few that are right up there, but the best one might have been when we won the league actually. Helen Dermody scored, I think it was against Forest, when she took it on a chest and volleyed it into the top corner. I wasn't there for it, but I saw the videos and I voted it for a goal of the season, it was just an absolute screamer.

## Wolves Women commentator Matt Ponter takes a look back at last season's FA Cup adventures.

Dan McNamara has always spoken about creating memories, and the FA Cup has provided those throughout the years. Last season was especially memorable, as the Old Gold reached the fifth round and faced Women's Super League opposition.

Overall the season provided many memorable moments: a tenth win in a row against West Bromwich Albion at Molineux, a comeback from 3-0 down to win against Nottingham Forest, and two 8-0 thrashings over other local rivals Stourbridge.

But, it was the FA Cup journey that sticks in the memory for a lot of the squad, and they hope to go far again this season.

It started with one of the 8-0 wins against Stourbridge, which saw Jade Cross net a hat-trick, Amber Hughes at the double, and goals spread elsewhere across the starting 11.

This set the team in good stead, as immediately afterwards they put seven past Peterborough United at the SEAH Stadium. It was Amber Hughes this time scoring a hat-trick, with plenty of other fantastic goals scored by the likes of Beth Roberts, Sophie Bramford, and Katie Johnson.

Wolves faced their first away tie in the third round at then fourth tier Hull City. The Tigers took the lead just before half-time, despite being down to 10 when Hope Knight saw red for colliding with keeper Bec Thomas.

Before Amber Hughes levelled the tie, Thomas had to be substituted due to injury, which saw the introduction of Wolves Women youngster Elise Stocking, who kept a clean sheet.

Morphet, Bramford, and a late fourth from Merrick pushed Wolves into the fourth round, where an away trip to Reading awaited.

Due to issues at Reading FC, the game was played at the home of Aldershot Town. The Old Gold arrived as the underdogs, but even when the home side took the lead, Dan McNamara wasn't too worried.

Beth Merrick broke free on the left, and placed a curling shot into the corner, sending the travelling fans into ecstasy. It could have been a lot different if Reading had taken their opportunity from the restart, but a narrow miss allowed Wolves to push forward again.

A few loose crosses bounced out and one eventually found Ellie Wilson, who placed a perfect ball in for Toussaint to head into the net only a couple of minutes from time.

There was little time for Reading to draw level, and Wolves made it into the fifth round for the first time since 2003.

We all eagerly awaited the draw, with WSL teams and away trips in mind. Wolves came out of the hat first, and were drawn at home to Brighton and Hove Albion. With coverage on the FA Player, and a high attendance expected, there was a huge buzz around the club in the build-up to the game.

Come match day, for times it seemed that McNamara's side could match every move made by Brighton. And, when Wolves were awarded a penalty at 1-0 down, Beth Merrick's equaliser from the spot lifted the crowd and the girls fought to take the game into extra-time.

Unfortunately it wasn't to be, as substitute Emma Kullberg not only netted her first goal for the away side, but a hat-trick to seal the tie for Brighton.

In his interview afterwards, McNamara mentioned how proud he was of the team.

"To share that goal with 1820 fans and hear the roar was incredible.

"Another special moment for this club, even better in the FA Cup."



## Making Memories in the FA Cup

## Wolves Women v Sporting Khalsa Women in the FA Cup

Today's meeting between Wolves and Khalsa will be the third time the teams have met in the Women's FA Cup and the first with Wolves as the home team, the other games taking place at the Guardian Warehousing Arena.

The initial meeting took place some eight years ago and was a fourth qualifying round game. It was the second tie in the competition for both, Wolves having overcome a strong Loughborough Foxes side by the odd goal in five whilst Khalsa eased past Coundon Sports to the tune of 7-0.

Wolves were much the better side in the first half and it was surprising that it took them until the last minute of the half to take the lead. A Laura McQuilkin corner was flicked on by Amber Quick for Natalie Widdal to put the ball beyond Khalsa keeper Stacey Parkes.

The second half was a total contrast, with Khalsa looking the more likely to score and they eventually equalised in the 81st minute when Jodie Bragan fired home from outside of

the area. Now with the momentum, they continued pushing and Lauren Walker gave them the lead in the dying moments of the game.

Undaunted, Wolves responded and in the fourth minute of added time were rewarded when Amber Quick slotted home from a goalmouth scramble to take the game to extra time. Wolves were now in the ascendancy and had the better of the additional time, taking the lead through McQuilkin in the 107th minute and wrapping things up shortly afterwards as Vicky Brackenbury headed home a Jen Anslow corner to secure a 4-2 win.

The last meeting was three years ago, this time in the first round, when the teams were competing at different levels, Wolves in the Northern Division and Khalsa in Division One North.

Khalsa were quickest off the mark and took the lead in the seventh minute, Megan Cann's diving header beating Shan Turner in the Wolves goal.

Wolves responded well but found home keeper Stacey Garnham in fine form as she repelled all efforts. It took until first half stoppage time for Tammi George to equalise, swiftly followed by an Amber Hughes effort that saw the visitors ahead at the break.

Hughes continued to cause Khalsa's defence problems when the second period started, netting again in the 56th minute before completing her hat-trick just after the hour mark, effectively ending the game as a contest. Anna Price grabbed a goal midway through the second half with George getting her second and Wolves' sixth with just over 10 minutes to play. Hughes scored her fourth in added time to wrap up a 7-1 win for the visitors.

All of which brings us to today's game with both teams now in the National League. Will Wolves be able to repeat their victory in the league earlier in the season, or will Sporting Khalsa turn the league table on its head and grab the win?

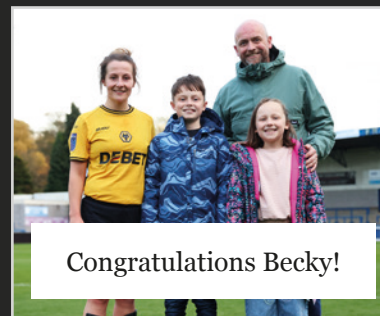
Layla Banaras has returned to Birmingham City concluding her dual-registration with us.

Consequently our home league fixture against Derby County has been brought forward to next Sunday 1st December and we hope to see you back here then.



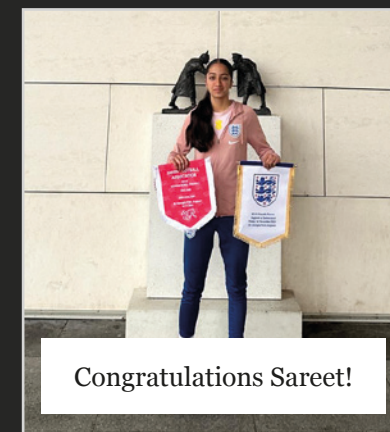
