## MATCH REPORT

Wolves **5** (J. Cross 18, Merrick 22, 36, Toussaint 56, Morphet 69 pen) - **0** Huddersfield FA WNL I Sunday 2nd April 2023

A record-breaking attendance for Wolves Women witnessed a five-star display as the old gold defeated Huddersfield Town in front of 3,834 fans in an atmosphere-filled Molineux who made their voices heard in support of the team.

It was also a historic afternoon for Tammi George and Anna Morphet who both celebrated a century of appearances for the pack.

It was a positive start for Dan McNamara's side as Wolves showed confidence in possession as they transitioned from defence to attack with great success. The best chance of the early stages fell to Destiney Toussaint after a precise through ball from George, however, Toussaint's attempt on goal went just wide as the old gold continued their search for the opener.

Wolves' positive play was eventually rewarded with the first goal of the game. It started with Beth Roberts' energy down the left as she raced down the wing and continued to cause problems for Huddersfield. She got in a position to play it over to Toussaint who then found Helen Dermody on the edge of the box. Dermody smashed an attempt on goal, but it bounced off the underside of the crossbar. However, Jade Cross was there to sniff out the rebound and get the first goal for Wolves as Molineux erupted.

It didn't take too long for Wolves to double their lead as Cross added an assist to her tally with a fantastic ball right to the foot of Beth Merrick who took her time and calmly placed the ball into the bottom corner of Lauren Joyce's goal.

Huddersfield tried to thwart the dominance of the old gold, but their attempts were unsuccessful as another period of dominance from Wolves led to their third of the first half.

In almost a repeat of the second goal, Cross picked up the ball and played it across to the feet of Merrick whose impressive composure continued to show as she placed it into the exact same corner to make it a brace for herself.

The game plan was different for Wolves in the second half as they started to play with more patience and an emphasis on keeping possession throughout the second half now that they had a comfortable lead.

That didn't mean that was that for the goals though, as Merrick received the ball on the right-wing before she played a floated cross across the Huddersfield goal which found the head of Toussaint. She was able to get herself a goal as her header fell perfectly into the bottom corner of Joyce's net.

Huddersfield found a little bit of momentum as they pushed forward in an attempt to find a goal. However, they were unable to find that goal as the Wolves defence seemed unbreakable in front of the Molineux crowd.

Before the Terriers could answer back, Wolves were able to continue to show their bite as a tricky run from George earned Wolves a penalty, as the two newest members of the 100 club worked together to get the old gold their fifth. Morphet stepped up and showed her composure as she buried the penalty to make it five on home soil.

It was a special occasion for debutant Naomi Bedeau who replaced Anna Price to make her Wolves debut in front of a record-breaking attendance at Molineux. Bedeau showed speed and great defensive positioning as she stepped right in, but the different dimensions offered caused new problems for the Huddersfield attackers.

The old gold would continue to retain possession and nullify the bark of the Terriers as they held onto their 5-0 victory to send the 3,843 fans home happy.

A 5-0 victory in front of a recordbreaking crowd gave manager McNamara plenty of reason to be proud of his team's performance, but he made it clear they need to stick with Nottingham Forest in the title race.

"We didn't want it to turn into just an occasion, we wanted it to be a football match and I thought the girls did that very well," McNamara said. "We have to keep going after the Nottingham Forest result, we have to make sure we're on their tail if they do slip up.

"It was very important to get the three points, I think when you have a look at what is going on, the amount of people in here getting inspired by this group of players and today was about more than just the result, it was amazing. I had a bit of a moment just before kick-off where I reflected on the five years that I have had here, what me and the staff have managed to achieve. It's a fantastic club to be a part of and long may it continue."

On getting to play at Molineux

"It's about making memories and they have made another one today. It's a fantastic occasion and you see the amount of young girls that are getting inspired by this club, they're having a real impact on the city. If you can see it then you can be it and those girls came out in their droves today to get behind the team. Hopefully we can continue this over the next few years, it's really important that we keep inspiring the next generation of young female footballers. The girls are doing that, and I am really proud of them."

# THE INTERVIEW NAOMI BEDEAU

As we push on to the end of the season we are delighted to welcome Naomi Bedeau to the club; our second signing from Stoke City this season.

Defender Naomi came off the bench to make her debut in our 5-0 win over Huddersfield at Molineux last Sunday, impressing fans with her pace and strength on and off the ball.

Read on to hear how she feels about joining the pack and her footballing background...

### Welcome to the pack Naomi, how excited are you to be here?

"It feels surreal. The welcome I've had has been incredible from all the girls and staff. I didn't expect it, so it's been really lovely."

### You've made your debut off the bench at Molineux, I bet you weren't expecting that?

"Again, it's surreal. I would not have expected to make a debut at such a big stadium with so many fans as well. Nearly 4,000, so I felt a bit of pressure, but it was a really good experience."

## You've come from Stoke and you've joined up with Beth Roberts who joined us not too long ago, has that been helpful in terms of settling in, having her here?

"It's helped massively. I had a few conversations with her before I joined, and she gave me a bit of an insight into what it's like at the club. She's been brilliant and I've spoken to her quite a lot, but I've also been around the other girls, and it's been really nice to get to know different groups of people."

#### How was your time at Stoke?

"I joined Stoke last season, so I was there for a year and a bit, and that was a really good experience for me as my first year playing in the National League. They were very supportive, the coaching staff and the players. I wish them all the best, but I want to develop as a player so that's why I made the choice to come here."

#### How would you describe yourself as a defender?

"I would say that I'm quick when I need to be, I play out from the back and step out well, so I would say they are my three main strengths."

### What are your first memories of football, and what did your career before Stoke entail?

"I've played football from the age of five. Before that I did dance and drama from when I was three and then I said to my dad I don't want to do that anymore, I want to play football. None of my family are football fans so he was confused, and he said to my dance instructor, she'll be back soon when she gets a few bruises and obviously that wasn't the case.

"I joined a local boys' team from the age of five, before joining Luton Town's academy aged nine to 11; it then got shut down. I then played quite locally to where I lived in Bedford and then joined Ipswich town aged 16 to 18. I then moved to Nottingham to go to university where I played with their team for a bit, before deciding I wanted to take football further, so joined Stoke."

#### Any footballing inspirations growing up?

"I've always followed Steph Houghton, because when I was growing up, she was England Captain and I also like Rachel Yankey with her being a black female in sport; I've met her a few times, and it was surreal. From the men's side of things, it would be Andrea Pirlo. He's technically very good, clean and he can play crazy passes."



#### What are you studying at university?

"I'm in my fourth year and finishing in a few months. I study maths and will be getting a Masters in it once I finish these four years. I'm not sure what I want to do afterwards but I want to work with logistics and people in some way."

#### What's it been like growing up playing the women's game as it's grown too?

"The quality is improving every year, but even the provisions you get, even starting off as a child, I would only ever dream of being a child at this stage of the game, it's wild. I wish I was eight years old watching these games thinking that's going to be me. When these young children grow up, they're going to be packing out stadiums. It's so cool to see it develop over the years, but it's been great to be a part of it as well.

#### Have you ever set yourself any career goals?

"When I was younger, my aim up until the age of 18 was wanting to get as far as I can with football without jeopardising my education and I'm now at a point where I'm finishing my education and I wouldn't say I've jeopardised it at all; I've prioritised football at points, but I've still done well with my education.

"I'm at a point now where I can start to prioritise football a bit more because I'm finishing education and I can put my career and what I want to go into as a second thought."

### TODAY'S OPPONENTS

LIVERPOOL FEDS





Liverpool Feds were formed in 1990, originating from the Liverpool Institute of Higher Education (now known as Liverpool Hope University) where the sports teams played as a Federation of the St Katherine's and Christ Notre Dame Colleges.

They commenced competitive football in the North West Women's Regional League and made steady progress. With player numbers increasing they added a reserve side in 1993 which was swiftly followed by a girls' youth section which played in the Liverpool County FA Girls' League. Natural progression saw the addition of a development squad and under 18s side as the club evolved. The youth section these days gives an opportunity to over 150 girls each week to play football.

Having stabilised themselves in their early years, they progressed through to the Premier Division of the North West Regional League in the late 1990s and went on to challenge at the top of the league in the early 2000s. Over a five season period they finished regularly in the top four, but were never able to capture the title.

That all changed in 2008/09 when they went unbeaten throughout the entire league campaign, drawing only three games. Title success saw them promoted to the Northern Women's Combination, the fourth tier of the women's game.

It took them a while to adapt to the higher league and they spent the next five seasons hovering around the lower half of the table. The summer of 2014 saw the reorganisation of the women's pyramid, with the Combination leagues joining the FA Women's Premier League, a change which saw Feds move into League Division One North. That season was their best at this level, and they finished as runners-up.

The summer of 2015 was one of change as they linked up with Marshalls FC to become Liverpool Marshall Feds. This alliance lasted for three years, a period in which they recorded two second and one third place finish before the club opted to break away and revert to Liverpool Feds in the summer of 2018.

The following season they captured the Liverpool County Cup for the second time before Covid struck and wiped out football for the best part of two years. Last season they finally captured the Division One North title at the eighth attempt, a win which raised them to their highest spot in the pyramid. To match that triumph, they captured the County Cup again and made it through to the semi-final of the FA Women's Premier League Cup where they lost narrowly to Huddersfield Town.


