

CHARLOTTE GREENGRASS

Wolves Women forward Charlotte Greengrass is next to sit in the programme hot seat this season and answer a few quirky questions.

WHAT IS THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACE YOU'VE PLAYED FOOTBALL?

It was probably at the City Ground when I was at Forest. I was there for quite a few years and we only started playing there in my second or third season. Building up to not playing there and when we finally got to play there, I think we played Man City first in the FA Cup and it was an 8-0 battering, but it was a great occasion. Then we played Derby there a few times which were always memorable – especially being an East Midlands derby.

WHAT ARE THE STRANGEST SUPERSTITIONS YOU'VE SEEN FROM TEAMMATES?

I don't know if I've really seen any. There's the classics of putting your boots on left or right first, people coming out of the dressing room in a certain position, but I don't think I've ever seen any strange ones. I'm not a superstitious person myself and try not to be. I went through a spell of having tape on my middle finger the season we won the league at Forest. I did it for one game and then I had to do it every game after that and then we won the league. But I couldn't keep doing it – I don't want to be one of those people who have a half hour ritual before a game.

WHAT IS THE GREATEST COMEBACK YOU'VE BEEN INVOLVED IN?

I actually don't think I've ever been involved in one particular come back. Rather than a game, the season I won the league with Forest, we were very much yo-yoing between Forest and Wolves, so getting that over the line was a comeback in itself, but in terms of a particular game itself, there isn't one that comes to mind.

WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST TASTE IN MUSIC?

'Robbo' [Beth Roberts] is the DJ at the minute, but the speaker's been playing up loads so we've been having some very suspect remixes of songs when the speaker decides to play up, so that's been something we've been putting up with the last few weeks. But Robbo's good on the music and always gets us going. She's a good DJ and I have to hand it to her. I know that's the opposite to the question, but the speaker playing up hasn't been helping anyone! Rechomy@ SREENGRASS

WHAT IS THE STRANGEST MOMENT YOU'VE EXPERIENCED IN A GAME?

These are such good questions and I have such boring answers! When I was younger playing with Leicester in their centre of excellence at Under-10s, we used to play on a really windy pitch, so people would score from the halfway line all the time. We were all like prime David Beckham.

WHO IS THE BIGGEST CHARACTER IN A DRESSING ROOM YOU'VE BEEN IN?

Another good question. Mai Moncaster is one. When we were at Forest, she used to bust out some crazy dance moves while we were getting ready to go out onto the pitch. Mai definitely is the first one that comes into my head. She was always doing crazy stuff and you'd see her in the warm-up and think, 'What is she doing?'

WHAT IS THE ODDEST THING YOU'VE HEARD SAID DURING MATCH?

You wouldn't be able to print half of the things I've heard said! Since I've become a forward, I didn't imagine the things that would be said between a centre-half and a forward. I love the sledging and the mind games – I'm here for it and I probably dish it out too much – but I'm slightly fuming that when I was a centre-half I never took advantage of it more. More often than not it's just funny to hear what people would say to try and get a reaction out of you.

WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST DRESS SENSE?

Abi Loydon. I wouldn't say it's bad, she's got a 'unique' style and she's so confident with it which makes it totally better. She's a unique queen and we love her for it. We've been out and she's turned up and I thought, 'Fair enough, Abi. You go girl!'

WHAT IS THE MOST UNEXPECTED RESULT YOU'VE HAD?

The one that unfortunately comes straight to my brain was when I was with Forest and we were 3-0 up away at Wolves with half an hour to go, and we lost 4-3. None of us expected to lose from that position. It's one that I can't get out my memory and it wasn't a great one at the time. When I was with Leicester we played some bigger teams and had some upsets, but the Wolves one is definitely the most memorable. I do try to shift it now to say, 'Well, I play at Wolves now, so we won!' But I don't think that quite flies.

WHAT IS THE BEST GOAL YOU'VE EVER SEEN SCORED?

When I was at Villa, I used to play full-back there so I very rarely scored, but I remember scoring one against Blackburn in the Conti Cup from about 25/30 yards out on the half volley. I hit it so sweetly and it just went in. That was one of my first ever goals, so that was a nice feeling. That was the best one I've scored, but in terms of the best goal I've ever seen, Beth Merrick and Amber Hughes come up with a new worldie every other week! They've already scored a few of those worldies this season and you could look back at me and see my jaw is on the floor, so any goal scored by those two.



A day out at the City Ground

Wolves Women commentator Matt Ponter takes us behind the scenes of last Sunday's game at Nottingham Forest.





A place steeped in history, the City Ground was our location last weekend for a crunch league game at the top of the Women's National League North. It was a simple case of first v second, with Forest leading the way by three points and a superior goal difference.

For those who have never travelled to the City Ground before or Nottingham in general for that matter, the stadium is located alongside the River Trent. Behind the Trent End, you can catch views of Meadow Lane, home to Notts County. Or if you walk out of the Peter Taylor Stand and look ahead you can see the perimeter and floodlights of Trent Bridge Cricket Ground.

As media I was allocated a parking space at the Bridgford end, which usually houses away supporters. After a short walk behind some houses the Peter Taylor Stand was in front of me, painted in the striking garibaldi red that Forest adopts as their home colour.

After picking up media accreditation, I met the rest of the media team for the afternoon and ventured out to find the press area. At Forest this means navigating through supporters, up a flight of stairs and then onto the concourse and finally to your seat. Compared to the other parts of the ground, the Peter Taylor Stand has kept its oldschool roots. The seats towards the back are still designed to appear like old wooden ones, but with plastic bars to meet safety regulations. There is plenty of leg room, and that includes in the press area itself which despite a low roof provides a fantastic view of the pitch. Once all my kit was organised for commentary, I was able to have a chat and catch-up with BBC Radio Nottingham correspondent Chris Gadsby. Chris covers a lot of women's football including Forest, has his own chat show, and away from football is heavily involved with both the Nottingham Panthers and Lions Ice Hockey teams.

We spoke a lot about Forest's season in the league and their outstanding defensive record, and just how Dan McNamara's side would be able to break through that defence to find the net.

Once the game had kicked off, it was clear that Forest were happy to hold onto a lot of possession. It was Wolves however who had a good couple of chances in the opening 15 minutes. Anna Morphet played a dangerous free kick towards the back post, with Destiney Toussaint reaching for the header only to hit the post.

Despite some pressure, Forest capitalised on a break down the right wing, with Domingo finding a gap to allow Melissa Johnson to convert a cross from short range. Chances became limited for the Old Gold, as Forest continued to dominate possession for good periods of the game.

Becky Anderson did find an opportunity late in the first half, when Emily Batty made a rare error at the back and found herself out of goal. The Forest keeper managed to scramble back however and make a comfortable save. As the teams emerged for the second half, I had barely caught my breath from reintroducing the line-ups before Charlotte Greengrass found the equaliser. The Wolves supporters located near to us cheered in excitement and remained right behind the team.

THE BRIAN GLOUGH STANI

There were plenty of chances for Wolves to go on and win the game as well: Anderson had a shot saved, Morphet came close from 25 yards and Amber Hughes nearly wrestled free, but her shot was eventually caught by Batty.

On the full-time whistle Dan turned to the Wolves support and gave a huge cheer followed by what seemed a sigh of relief. He summed up the game positively, even saying that "On another day, we would probably have nicked it!

"There was a fantastic work ethic, right around the group and I am delighted with them all."

Focus now turns to today's game against Stoke City, a side who held off title hopefuls Burnley last weekend. The run in for Dan McNamara's side isn't going to be plain sailing, and the team will need all your support to spur them on right to the end!

Stoke City Women

The club was formed in 2001 as Stoke City Ladies and began playing in the West Midlands League Division One North, in what was then the sixth tier of women's football in England. The team finished in third position in that first season, some 10 points behind champions Crewe Vagrants, however, they gained promotion to the Premier Division.

They spent the next seven seasons at that level, always finishing in a top half position but never quite managing to mount a title challenge. That was before the 2008/09 season when they almost defeated everything that was put in front of them. Collecting 81 points throughout the campaign, they finished a massive 35 points clear of runners-up Solihull to capture the Premier League title for the first time and with it promotion to the Midland Combination League.

They handled the step up in class well
and finished in a creditable mid-
table position that first season, also
capturing the Staffordshire County Cup
for the fourth time.Since that first season in the Nation
League they have finished no lower
than seventh with four consecutive
fourth-place finishes from 2015/16
onwards. In 2019/20 they were

Mainitaining the momentum, they continued to improve over next couple of campaigns, eventually finishing the 2011/12 season as League and Cup runners-up to Wolves. Everything was put right the following term as they captured the title and with it promotion to the FA Women's Premier League Northern Division. In March 2013 the club applied to join the expanding FA Women's Super League, but was one of the unsuccessful applicants.

That first season in what is now the third tier of women's football was a good one for the Potters. They finished in mid-table, just four points behind the runners-up, although they were a distant 20 points behind champions Sheffield FC Ladies.

Since that first season in the National League they have finished no lower than seventh with four consecutive fourth-place finishes from 2015/16 onwards. In 2019/20 they were looking to capture silverware having made their way through to the League Cup Final, only for the season to be terminated early when the country was locked down.

The summer of 2023 saw a major step forward both on and off the field with the announcement that the club would become semi-professional for the 2023/24 season following significant investment from the owners of Stoke City FC. Former Women's Super League winner and Republic of Ireland international Marie Hourihan was also appointed as the club's first full time coach.

Congratulations to Lily Simkin who was named Player of the Match in her first start for the club as Wolves ran out 4-0 winners against Sporting Khalsa. The award, sponsored by Purcell Branding, was presented by Wolves director John Bowater.

Congratulations to Wolves Women manager Dan McNamara on being named FA WNL Northern Premier Division Manager of the Month for January. After securing league wins over Stourbridge and Derby County Wolves ended the month at the top of the table.

Good luck to Welsh Under-19 international Ania Denham who has joined Sporting Khalsa for the remainder of the season as part of our ongoing partnership. She will still be training at Wolves but will play match minutes with Khalsa. She'll also be heading to Portugal this month for a Welsh Under-19 friendly tournament.

After 18 months and 31 appearances in old gold, Hannah Fryer has departed the club. We wish her all the best for the future.




