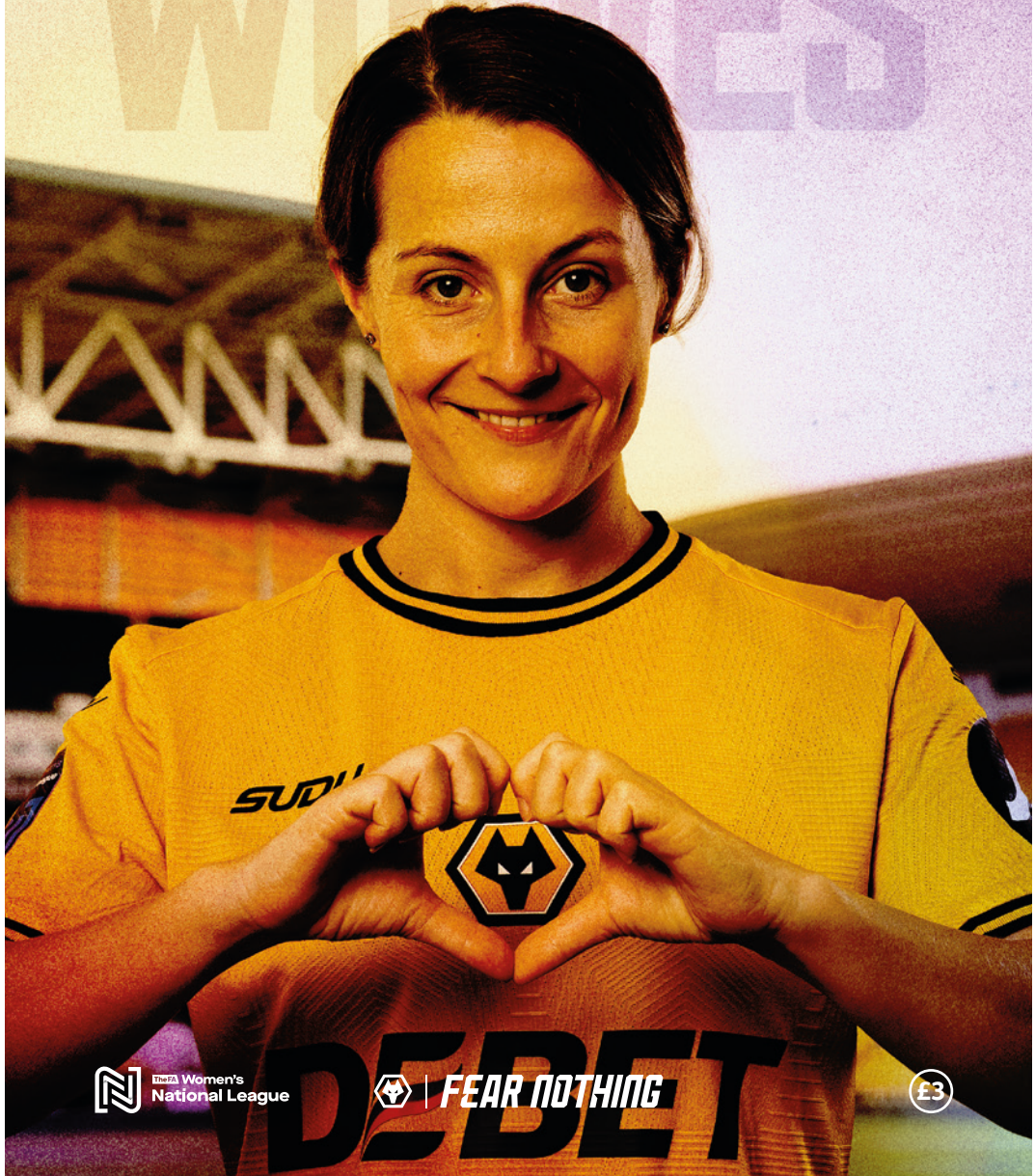

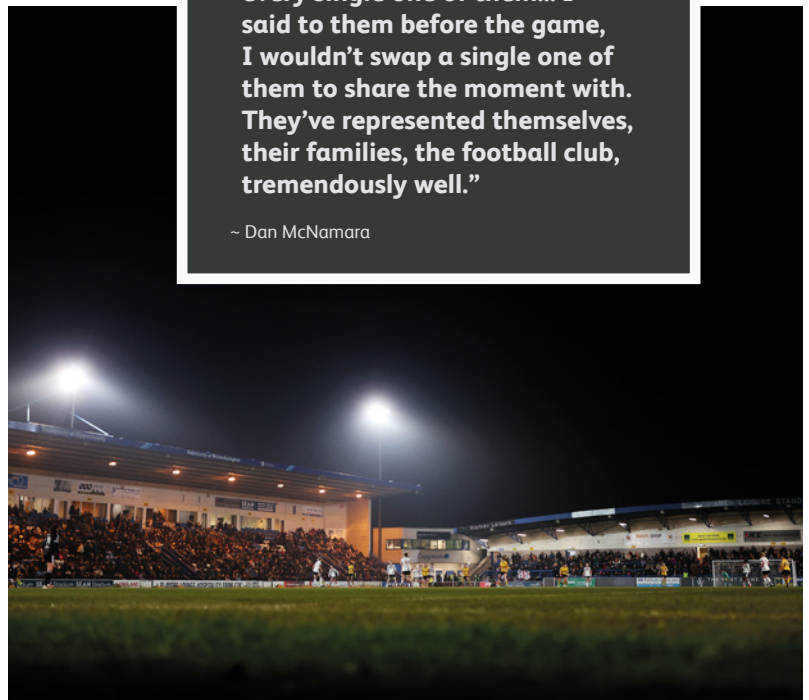

RACHEAL QUIGLEY

Wolves Women forward Racheal Quigley is next to sit in the programme hot seat this season and answer a few quirky questions.

WHAT IS THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACE YOU'VE PLAYED FOOTBALL?

One of my most memorable has to be playing at West Bromwich Albion in their stadium and being part of the eight-nil win! In Australia, we dream of playing in the big stadiums over here and for it to be a derby was even better.

WHAT ARE THE STRANGEST SUPERSTITIONS YOU'VE SEEN FROM TEAMMATES?

I don't think there's too many strange superstitions around the changing room. The only thing I've noticed is Tammi George trying to scab a bite of banana because she doesn't want to eat the whole thing!

WHAT IS THE GREATEST COMEBACK YOU'VE BEEN INVOLVED IN?

This one would be back home in Australia playing for Adelaide United against Western Sydney. We went 2-1 down and came back to win the game 10-2!

WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST TASTE IN MUSIC?

I'm throwing Josie [Smith] under the bus here. Her taste in music is a bit erratic depending on her mood and she can't sit through a whole song. In fact, she will tactically change the song when you're belting a high note!



WHAT IS THE STRANGEST MOMENT YOU'VE EXPERIENCED IN A GAME?

Back home in Australia, there were a couple of butt-naked streakers running across the field mid-game. They were my friends, but I've always denied it – until this day!

WHO IS THE BIGGEST CHARACTER IN A DRESSING ROOM YOU'VE BEEN IN?

Abi Loydon has to be the quirkiest teammate I've ever had – although half of the time I have no idea what she's saying! But she'll throw down some well-practiced dance moves and she can instantly put a smile on your face.



WHICH OF YOUR WOLVES TEAMMATES HAS THE WORST DRESS SENSE?

I don't think it's a bad dress sense, but you wouldn't catch me wearing some of the outfits Abi Loydon is rocking. But she really rocks it.

WHAT IS THE MOST UNEXPECTED RESULT YOU'VE HAD?

Once I was in a team which went down to 10 players when it was 1-1 but came back to win 5-2. Unbelievable scenes.

WHAT IS THE BEST GOAL YOU'VE EVER SEEN SCORED?

A long time ago now, when I was at Adelaide, I won Goal of the Year in the Australian W-League with a bicycle kick.





Sporting Khalsa

Formed in 2004 under the name FC Reedswood in the Birchhills area of Walsall, the club played its initial football in the West Midlands Regional Women's League. They established themselves in Division One North and were able to push on to become champions in the 2011/12 season, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. They also made their way through to the Stafford County Cup Final where they were defeated by a strong Stoke City.

The following season they finished third in their first season at the higher level before capturing the Premier League title in 2013/14, an 11-1 home victory over Wednesfield Town securing the trophy. That success saw them elevated to the national stage as they were promoted to the FA Women's Premier League.

Life at that level started well for Reedswood and they secured a comfortable mid-table position in their first season. Major transformation, however, took place during the summer of 2015 as the Reedswood team moved from Long Lane, Eccleshall to the Aspray Arena in Willenhall to form the women's section of Sporting Khalsa and, in the process, take on their name.

Things did not start well as Sporting Khalsa and they were in the bottom two places for much of the 2015/16 season. A turnaround in results in the last two months saw a number of crucial victories gained and they eventually finished just above the relegation line. They won their final five games and were also indebted to Wolverhampton Wanderers who avoided defeat against Peterborough Northern Star in the last game of the season, a result which relegated Boro' and helped Khalsa retain their FA Women's Premier League status.

Building on the reprieve they moved up to third the following season before dropping back down to mid-table in 2017/18. The drop in league position was compensated as they made their way through to the second round of the WFA Cup for the first time. A solid term in 2018/19 was followed by the two Covid-hit seasons.

When full time football resumed they again finished mid-table before moving back up to third the following term. 2023/24 was the most successful in the club's history as they ultimately captured the Midlands Division One title in an epic battle with Loughborough Lightning. Winning their final eight games of the campaign they eventually captured the league title on goal difference to gain promotion to the Northern Division. Alongside this they captured the Staffordshire County Cup for the first time after suffering defeat in their previous eight finals.
