## Wolves Women Baby news!

**Wolves Women captain Helen Dermody has revealed the exciting news that she is pregnant with her first child.**

The midfielder has been out of action with a knee injury she picked up at the end of September, but will now miss the remainder of the season as she and her partner, Rich, prepare for their new arrival expected in March 2024.

Dermody recently shared the news with players and staff at Compton Park and will continue her recovery from injury with the medical team, while being supported with her pregnancy in the coming months.

Speaking on her news, Dermody said: "It's really exciting. It was a bit of a shock at first but now we've got used to it, we are very excited.

"It's the unknown because I've never been through it before. I've got nieces and nephews, but you can hand them back! To be expecting our first child, we're both really excited about it."

Dermody has explained that she had to remain tight-lipped until the time was right to tell the rest of the squad, but admits that the reaction to the news has been better than she could ever imagine.

"We kept it quiet until we got our first scan," Dermody continued. "I think that's the best way to do it just in case anything is wrong.

"I told the physio from a medical point of view. In a way, it was lucky because I've been injured with my knee and that's stopped me playing. I told Macca and then the girls the following session.

"To be honest, they've all been really supportive and really excited for us. I couldn't have asked for it to go any better."

Everyone at Wolves sends Helen and Rich their warm congratulations ahead of the new addition to the pack.

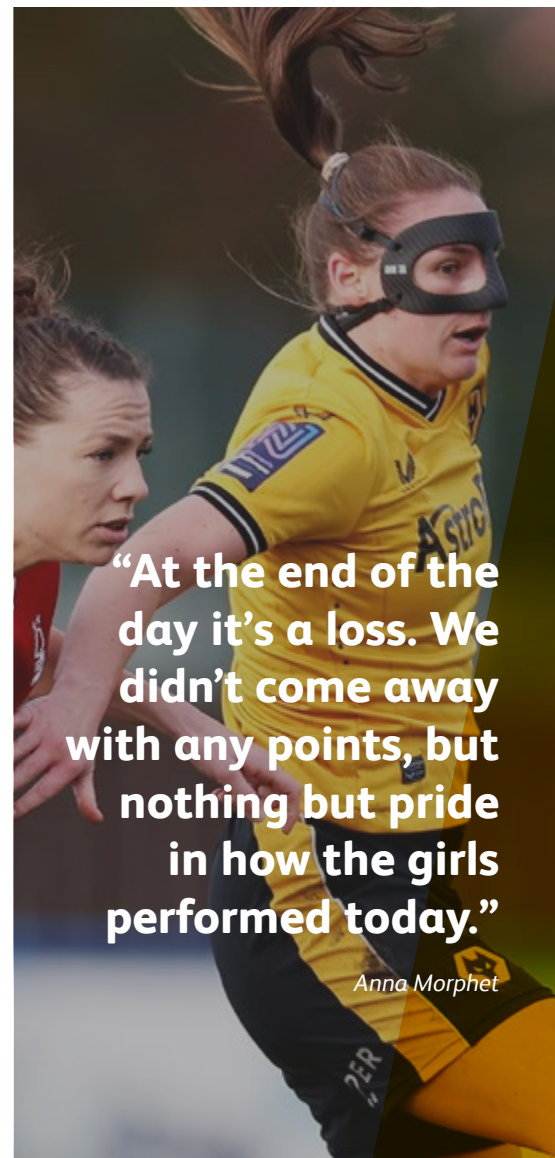

# Liv Fergusson: In the spotlight

Women's first-team forward Liv Fergusson dissects the winger position before delving into the future to predict what her career, Wolves Women and women's football could look like in five years' time.

## POSITIONAL PLAY

### Did you always want to be a winger?

When I started off playing seven-a-side I was a defender, but when I played in the girls' teams I was always an attacker, and as soon as the pitch got bigger, I was always a wide player. I have played down the middle quite often in senior football, but I would always want to be an attacking wide player.

### What is the best part of being a winger?

You have the freedom to be creative and you can put your own spin on it. You have wide players who like to take players on, some just like to deliver, some like to cut inside, some like to cut outside, so you can always be creative in the role, while getting the plaudits by contributing with goals and assists.

### What is the hardest part of being a winger?

Work rate is a big one because you're obviously having to cover large areas of the pitch and constantly having to get up and down. There's also the challenges of being up against a tough full-back or having to break down a team which plays with a low block and back five with not much space.

### What qualities are needed to be a winger?

You can be quite unique as a wide player. You see so many different styles, but generally you need a bit of speed, you need to be good

at one-v-ones, attacking and defending and have the ability to go on the outside and cross and go on the inside and shoot.

### What do you work on most as a winger?

The relationship with the full-back is a big one, in terms of positioning, but you're mainly working on your attacking one-v-ones and getting the crosses into dangerous areas in the box

### What other position would you like to play?

I might be really boring, but probably full-back. I know that's quite similar to being a wide player, but I couldn't see myself anywhere else on the pitch. I just love the wide areas and hugging the touchline!

### What is the hardest other position to play?

In my opinion, it's centre midfield. Being a wide player, you can see the whole pitch in front of you, but to play in midfield, it's quite difficult. You need 360-degree vision and eyes in the back of your head so you can receive the ball in tight areas and get out of them.

### Which other wingers do you watch and learn from?

I wouldn't say learn from as I'm older than most of them! But when I was at Bristol, Lauren Hemp came into our first team to make her senior debut and I love watching her play. I love seeing how she's developed over the years and would always recommend young girls wanting to be an 'old-school' winger to watch Lauren.



## IN FIVE YEARS' TIME...

### PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Hopefully I'll be retired! Coming here and playing for Wolves has been massive for me as I've been here, there and everywhere during my career, but I would love to be here until I finish playing. I don't want to sound disrespectful, saying that I've come down to tier three to end my career, because the league is so good now and the standard has improved so much, but as a Wolves fan, it means everything to end my career at the club I've supported my whole life.

### WOLVES' FUTURE

We all want to say Super League, but realistically, I would love for us to be an established team in the Championship. Hopefully we can go up either this year or the year after and consolidate for a few years, and then we can look at smashing it in the Championship and look to push on to the Super League.

### HOPES FOR THE WOMEN'S GAME

The opportunities for it are endless. After seeing the last five or 10 years, you couldn't see how far it's come along, so imagine what it will be like in another five years. With regards to England and the Lionesses, I would love to see us win more tournaments, the Euros again and of course the World Cup.

### CHANGES TO WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

Personally, I would like to see the leagues restructured. Even if they just did 14 teams in the top two leagues, we need to get a few more professional teams going, particularly with how good tier three is now. Several of the teams in our league would do well higher up the pyramid – the likes of us, Forest, Newcastle, Burnley, and that's just in the northern tier, that's not even looking at the south. For me, that's the next step if we want to keep growing the game because clubs are waiting to go up to the Championship before they change their models, but, at the moment, it's so hard to get out of tier three, it's actually slowing the development down.

### REMEMBERING THE CURRENT WOLVES TEAM

Looking at the group we've got now, we would all love to be remembered as the team that got Wolves to the Championship. They've already been promoted and won consecutive league titles over the last few years, but if you can be the team which takes Wolves from amateur to professional level, I'd love to be part of that.



## Meet Brooke Cairns

**Wolves Women have bolstered their midfield ranks with the signing of Brooke Cairns on a short-term deal.**

Cairns, 20, arrives at Wolves having departed West Ham United at the end of last season and previously played for Everton and Liverpool before signing for the Hammers in August 2021.

The midfielder has played in the Women's Super League for West Ham, while also featuring for Hashtag United and Ipswich Town on loan in the last couple of seasons.

Cairns also has experience internationally having been capped by England at under-16, under-17 and under-18 level.

The former Young Lioness has been allocated shirt number 24 and made her debut as a substitute in the 3-1 win at West Bromwich Albion.

Manager Dan McNamara said: "Brooke's joining us at a really good time. She's an outstanding young football player who has been training with Liverpool to keep herself fit.

"She left West Ham in the summer and at the minute, due to a couple of injuries, it works for both parties.

"We needed a little bit of cover in that central area and Brooke wants to get some game time in. It worked both ways and thankfully we've managed to get it done.

"Even if we can play a small part in Brooke's journey while she helps us out in this tough moment, then we'll all be happy and we can go from there."



## Meet Ania Denham

**After a long wait for international clearance, Wales under-17 international Ania Denham has officially signed for Wolves Women and made her league debut as a substitute in the 4-0 win against Huddersfield.**

The youngster linked up with Dan McNamara's squad after previously spending time with Caernarfon Town Academy.

An international at youth level with Wales, Denham impressed in pre-season when she came off the bench to score with her first touch in senior football against Oxford United - a sublime curling effort into the net from the edge of the penalty area.

A young and exciting prospect, manager McNamara has provided more background on recruiting the attacking midfielder and said: "Ania was recommended to me by a good friend of mine, Pete Wilson, who had her at North Wales Academy. He said she'd expressed an interest in coming to have a look at the environment and I know a couple of clubs were after her, so we brought her in.

"Right from the word go, you can see how much quality she's got. She's an exceptional talent for 16 years old and we were delighted when she came in.

"I know she's been chomping at the bit to get into Wolves and start her career. She actually came in for the under-21 squad and three weeks into pre-season I had to make the decision to take her in the first-team squad because she was that impactful within training and in the first few friendlies.

"Everyone saw that she's got an eye for goal and she's a great talent. The best thing for me is that she's a wonderful person to work with, which is a credit to her parents.

"We've got to manage expectations because she is only 16 and we've got a lot of work to do on and off the pitch, but we're really looking forward to helping her in the next stages of her journey."

# TONIGHT'S OPPONENTS:

## STOURBRIDGE FC WOMEN



Stourbridge FC Women were formed in 2012 as Stourbridge Ladies, playing in the Birmingham County League Division Two. Three rapid promotions saw the Glassgirls join the West Midlands Regional League in 2016, having finished as runners-up in the County League in 2015/16, as well as winning the league's Open Cup in the same season.

Mid-table finishes in the first three seasons in WMRL Division One South were followed by a stunning 2019/20 season in which they won all 14 of their league matches before the campaign was curtailed due to the Coronavirus pandemic. No fewer than 95 goals were scored and just two conceded in that campaign, and the League Cup semi-final was also reached - but never played.

The 2020/21 season saw the team win their opening three league fixtures before lockdown again brought things to an early end, but the autumn was dominated by a thrilling Vitality Women's FA Cup run taking in six rounds. Port Vale, Wyrley, Knowle, Worcester City and Crusaders were all beaten before Wolves ended Stourbridge's run.

Despite two abandoned seasons, the summer of 2021 brought good news as the FA announced a system of upward movement to offset the stagnation in the pyramid caused by the pandemic, and Stourbridge were granted elevation to the WMRL Premier Division at Tier Five.

Their first campaign at that level was a phenomenally successful one, winning the league title by 10 points and suffering just one defeat all season. The Glassgirls also

enjoyed huge cup success, winning the WMRL Premier Division Cup as well as reaching the semi-finals of the Birmingham County Cup for the first time, and the third round of the Vitality Women's FA Cup, losing 0-3 at home to FA Women's Championship (Tier Two) side Sheffield United in front of a record crowd of over 400 at the War Memorial Ground.

A second consecutive promotion meant that 2022/23 would see FA Women's National League football for the first time in the club's history, a remarkable achievement in such a short time span, with the team also rebranded as Stourbridge Women ahead of their fresh challenge.

Whilst ambitions at the start of the campaign were understated, the team once again took almost everyone by surprise, brushing aside an opening day defeat to go on a 19-match winning run which saw the Division One Midlands Title secured with two games to spare. 86 goals were scored (the joint highest across the entire National League) and only 16 conceded as Stourbridge finished as champions by a staggering 12-point margin.

Having begun as a single team, the women's and girls' section now includes a reserve team - also now playing in the FAWNLI system - and for 2023/24 a new development team, meaning a third senior team within the club, thereby strengthening the pathway from its thriving junior section.

Congratulations to Wolves keeper Shan Turner who won two more caps for Northern Ireland in the recent UEFA Women's Nations League games against Hungary, bringing her total to six. After a 3-2 defeat in Gyor, Hungary and a 1-1 draw in Belfast, Northern Ireland sit third in League B Group One, one point behind Hungary with two games left to play. The team's fixtures will conclude with an away game in Albania and a home game against the Republic of Ireland at the start of December.
