

Ellie Wilson

A former international at youth level for England, 26-year-old Ellie began her career with Reading and gained promotion as champions to the Women's Super League in her first season at the club before joining Bristol City where she was promoted for the second successive campaign in 2016.




She then moved onto London Bees and Sheffield United, signing for the latter in 2020, before departing Bramall Lane in May this year.

Dan McNamara was delighted to welcome Ellie to his defensive ranks. He said: "Ellie is another player we are bringing into the club with a great pedigree in the women's game. She's been at a lot of big Championship clubs and started last season as Sheffield United's first-choice right-back.

Wilson grew up in a family of Wolves supporters, and McNamara believes the added incentive to play for Wolves was too hard to turn down from an emotional standpoint.

"We've had Ellie come into the club and her family - originally from Bridgnorth - are passionate Wolves fans.

"They've shown how much they love the football club, so it can be quite a powerful sway to get these kinds of players in."



Hannah Fryer

Hannah has previous experience at AFC Fylde, Blackburn Rovers, Sheffield FC, Manchester City and in Germany with FC Nurnberg.

McNamara said: "Hannah comes with loads of experience and arrives from Fylde. I think she's been player of the season there for the last two seasons and she felt like she needed a new challenge.

"She's liked what she's seen over the last couple of months and last few years when we've been competing against each other. It's really good experience to bring into the back line and she'll cover that right-hand side of the pitch.

"I'm excited by what Hannah can bring and the girls have bought into her. She's been a real favourite within the group, and she's got real quality as well. We're looking forward to working with her over the next 12 months."

Shan Turner:

International Success

Wolves Women goalkeeper Shan Turner has described playing in front of over 36,000 fans for her country as a 'surreal feeling'.

The shot-stopper recently returned from international duty with Northern Ireland, where she collected her third and fourth caps in competitive Nations League fixtures against the Republic of Ireland and Albania.

Although the bragging rights went the way of the Republic of Ireland following a 3-0 victory, Turner has spoken about the 'incredible' atmosphere at the Aviva Stadium before heading back to Belfast for her first home fixture and clean sheet, which came courtesy of a 1-0 success over Albania.

Turner has also described the process of being selected for an international camp, while touching on the story behind her inclusion in the 2022 European Championships squad and the ambition of wanting to be Northern Ireland's number one.

ON HER FIRST COMPETITIVE CAPS

"It was my first actual competitive caps so it was a little bit nerve wracking. The first one being against Republic of Ireland at the Aviva Stadium.

"I was a little bit nervous but not as nervous as I was the first couple of times. It wasn't the result we wanted against them, but we bounced back and got the three points on Tuesday night (against Albania) so it was good."

ON THE ATMOSPHERE AGAINST REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

"It was just incredible. The minute you went out for the warm up it was starting to build-up and get even more. Then you went out for the national anthems and everything like that – you couldn't hear anything. "You couldn't hear each other on the pitch, you couldn't hear anything. We didn't have as many fans there but you could still hear them over the 33,500 Republic fans which was good."

ON WHETHER SHE EVER EXPECTED THIS

"Absolutely not. I think the most I played in front of before was when I played Wales and that was about 10,000 so to hit 36,000 people, which is bigger than Molineux, you think it's never going to happen in your life. It was a surreal feeling."

ON KEEPING HER FIRST INTERNATIONAL CLEAN SHEET

"It's something I definitely wanted and needed. My first three caps have been against Scotland, Wales and Republic of Ireland, so they've been the local ones.


"It was nice to play against a country (Albania) where we went into it a little bit more positive and thinking we could get a result.

"Especially with it being at home and my first game in Belfast, it was really nice to get a clean sheet and the three points."

ON WHETHER SHE KEEPS HER SHIRTS

"I've got both of my shirts. I like to keep them. International shirts are something you want to treasure quite a lot – especially the one from my first clean sheet and first home game. It's a nice one to keep.

"I've already got some shirts framed – I've got some Wolves ones and another Northern Ireland one, so I'll get some of them framed and then I've got a collection of them all that I'll keep with my caps I've got from when I was younger and caps I'll get from these ones."







ON HOW YOU GET TOLD YOU'RE IN THE SQUAD

"We get it through email. We get an email two weeks before and you know when it's coming, so you sit there for the 24 hour period refreshing your emails and thinking 'when's it going to come?'.

"That gives you two weeks to fully prep and prepare for what you're going to go away for and whether you're at home for it or travelling for it."

ON GETTING TOLD SHE WAS IN THE EUROS SQUAD LAST SUMMER

"I went away for two weeks. It was two weeks after the play-off final. I got an email asking to go and train full-time with them for two weeks.

"I was in Greece at the time and then I got the email. When I was there, there were quite a few keepers that had been involved and I'd not been involved for that long so didn't expect anything.

"I'd fallen asleep on the Sunday and was having a bit of a nap and I got a phone call from the manager at the time. It was like 'I just want to tell you you've been selected for the Euros'.

"It's one of those moments where you feel like you want to cry but you're in so much shock you don't know what to do.

"I hadn't even had time to go downstairs and tell my Dad or anything and I'd had another call saying it's top secret, you can tell your parents but that's it. I'd not even taken it in yet that I was going and it wasn't until you land, you're there, you have the charter flight, you land in Southampton and it was like 'wow'."

ON WANTING TO BE NORTHERN IRELAND'S NUMBER ONE

"Absolutely. I want to keep going. I got the chance to get my first cap with Jackie Burns unfortunately getting injured which you never want to wish on anyone, but I'm hoping I can take my chances and it can push on and I can keep getting as many caps as possible."



SOPHIE BRAMFORD

Former England youth international Sophie has rejoined Wolves. She has made her return this season after two years away at Aston Villa, Nottingham Forest and Stoke City and brings considerable experience as an attacking midfielder.

Anna Price: In the spotlight

Wolves Women captain Anna Price dissects the centre-midfield position before delving into the future to predict what her career, Wolves Women and women's football could look like in five years' time.

POSITIONAL PLAY

DID YOU ALWAYS WANT TO PLAY CENTRE-MIDFIELD?

I started out as a youngster on the right of midfield and moved more centrally as I got older and more experienced, but I've always admired midfielders and they were always the players that I enjoyed watching and wanted to be like.

WHAT IS THE BEST PART OF PLAYING CENTRE-MIDFIELD?

You're involved all of the time! Going forward you're having to join in and support the play, and then as a defensive midfielder, you're key in protecting the back line, so it's great to be involved all the time and being in the thick of it.

WHAT IS THE HARDEST PART OF PLAYING CENTRE-MIDFIELD?

Being aware of everything going on around you. Because you are in the middle of the pitch, you've got to have that special awareness of players being behind you and the ones in front of you as well, so it's that special awareness of where you are on the pitch.

WHAT DO YOU WORK ON MOST AS A CENTRAL MIDFIELDER?

My passing. Growing up, I always enjoyed practicing my long-range and short-range passing, and also heading. I've always worked hard at heading the ball and being brave – it's always something I've enjoyed and a skill that I've always encouraged within my game.

WHAT QUALITIES ARE NEEDED TO PLAY CENTRE-MIDFIELD?

You need to be a good passer of the ball and have 360-degree awareness of everything that's going on around you. You've also got to be a good ball winner and tackler as you're needed to break up play and win balls aerially, so good in the air.

WHAT OTHER POSITION WOULD YOU LIKE TO PLAY?

It would be good to be a striker. If I was good enough in front of goal, I'd love to be a striker – get all the glory when you score and win the games for the team!

WHAT IS THE HARDEST OTHER POSITION TO PLAY?

I always thought playing out on the wing was tough. You're expected to get up and down, it's constant movement. You have to tuck in when the ball is over the other side, so I would find playing out wide quite difficult.

WHICH OTHER CENTRAL MIDFIELDER DO YOU WATCH AND LEARN FROM?

Keira Walsh is unbelievable. She plays centremidfield for England and she's someone that you watch now at the top of her game, and if I was a young girl, she would be the one who I would be looking up to, try to mimic and be like.



IN FIVE YEARS' TIME...

PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

I hope in five years' time that I'll still be involved in the women's game. It's not necessarily going to be as a player – because I'm old! I've been playing football for almost 30 years now, but I'd love to still be involved within the game in some capacity even if it is just as a fan of the team.

WOLVES' FUTURE

I'd love for Wolves to be a professional women's football club and for the team to be playing in the top tier of English football. That's what I dream will happen in the near future. I know it won't be with me playing, but if I can be involved and see Wolves get to the Women's Super League and for all the girls to be playing full-time and that be their job, I would love it.

HOPES FOR THE WOMEN'S GAME

I hope that more tiers will become full-time and professional. Currently tier one is professional, a lot of teams are full-time in tier two, and it's starting to creep into our tier, so it would be amazing if the top four tiers of women's football were full-time – it would be unbelievable for the game and for females, to inspire all the young girls that they can be full-time footballers, just like little boys can.

CHANGES TO WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

I would just like to see continued opportunities for girls and females to play football more often. We're going in the right direction, but I would like to see more full-time opportunities, whether that's at college level or scholarships like the academy boys have at 16 to 18. It would be great to see that filtered down at more clubs down the tiers, so it's not just the Super League and Championship clubs. The more time given to young girls to be full-time, the better the standard will become.

REMEMBERING THE CURRENT WOLVES TEAM

I hope we're remembered as a team that has done everything we can for the badge and have given our all on the pitch. I want us to have shown the city how good female players are and technically can be.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS: HUDDERSFIELD TOWN





The club was originally founded in the summer of 1988 as Huddersfield Ladies FC and joined the North-East Regional League Division Two where, in their first season, they won the League and Cup double.

Over the next few seasons, the team developed well and come the end of the 1992/93 season they merged with Huddersfield Town Juniors. The immediate benefit was that the new club boasted competitive teams at Open Age, Under 16, Under 14 and Under 12 levels.

The 1993/94 season saw the first team carry all before them, losing only once all season and winning the League Championship, League Cup and Yorkshire Cup. The following season they retained the League Championship, winning all 16 league matches and scoring 101 goals in the process, conceding only 14. Although failing to retain the Knockout Cup, they held on to the Yorkshire Cup, beating a strong Newcastle side 5-3 in the final, and made it to the Women's Premier League in 1995.

The team started well in the Premier League Northern Division and were runners-up in their first season. That initial season, however, was not built upon and gradually the decline set in, and they were eventually relegated back to the Yorkshire and Humberside League after a six year stay.

The recovery took some time, but they eventually rose into the Northern Women's Combination in 2010. From there it took them a further four years before they returned to the national stage, gaining promotion back to the Premier League in 2014. That summer wasn't all success though, as they lost the backing of the men's team and had to fend for themselves.

Since returning to the Premier League, they have established themselves at this level, consistently finishing in and around the middle of the table. Following the full return after the pandemic they fared better, battling their way through to the final of the League Cup where they eventually lost to Southampton Women.

Last season they started well and before the turn of the year were challenging at the top of the table. Form, unfortunately dipped in the second half of the season and they eventually had to settle for sixth place. Current manager Glen Preston returned to the club in November 2021 for his second spell at the helm and this season is assisted by Mo Mouelhi, Carwyn Hughes and physio Charlotte Frisby.
